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KANGAROO MOTHER CARE (KMC)

 Kangaroo mother care (KMC) is a special way of caring for low birth weight babies

It improves health their babies

The baby is continuously kept in skin to skin contact with the mother and breast feeding exclusively

PROBLEMS OF LBW BABIES

- High mortality rate
- Hypothermia
- Hypoglycemia
- Apnea
- Hypoxia
- Infection
- Poor weight gain
- Prolonged NICU stay

BENEFITS TO THE BABY

 Offers prolonged skin to skin contact between the mothers

 KMC facilitates physiological stability in baby KMC reduce apnea, oxygen requirement and risk of infection to the baby

 KMC help in early discharge of babies from NICU

BENEFITS TO MOTHER

 KMC promote better mother infant bonding

 Mother is less stressed during KMC as the mother is more actively involved in the care

BENEFITS TO THE FAMILY

- KMC is economical to the family
- KMC promotes early discharge of baby
- KMC facilitates bonding between the baby, mother and the family

BENEFITS TO THE NATION

 KMC decrease neonate and infant mortality and morbidity

 KMC is simple easily applicable, cost effective

 KMC results in healthier and more intelligent babies

COMPONENTS OF KMC

- Three major components are:
- Kangaroo position: Skin to skin contact
- Kangaroo nutrition: exclusive breast feeding
- Kangaroo early discharge and regular follow up

1.KANGAROO POSITION-

- Skin to skin contact for 24 hours in a vertical position between mothers breasts & her clothes.
- Baby's head turned on one side in slight extended position. Hands are kept above the breasts & legs beneath in frog position.
- Slight extended head position keeps airways open and allows eye to eye contact between mother & baby.

2.EXCLUSIVE BREAST FEEDING-

- Mother's milk provides all necessary nutrients for physical & mental growth.
- Colostrum- initial thick milk.
- Prevents infection, malnutrition & allergies.

3.EARLY DISCHARGE AND REGULAR FOLLOW UP-

- Weight gain of 15-20 gm/kg/day for 3 consecutive days.
- Successfully breast feeding or expressed breast milk.
- Baby in kangaroo position for 24 hours.
- Maintaining temperature without assistance.
- No evidence of illness.
- Educate the mother regarding danger signs of apnea, difficulty breathing, convulsions, decreased feeding, decreased activity, hypothermia/hyperthermia.
